Stabenow Wins Second Debate

Bouchard Ignores Jobs, Dodges on Iraq

Detroit—In the second televised debate between Senator Stabenow and Mike Bouchard, Debbie Stabenow again scored a decisive victory as Bouchard floundered, failing to even muster a yes or no answer on how he would have voted on the war in Iraq.

Stabenow continued to stress her record of real results for Michigan and her agenda to help protect and create jobs. For the second time in four days, Mike Bouchard failed to address the number one issue on the minds of Michigan: Jobs.

“It was apparent again today that there is a clear choice in this election between the concrete results that I’ve delivered for Michigan and someone who supports the failed Bush policies that have cost us jobs and put our Michigan way of life at risk,” said Stabenow. “There’s no maybe button in the United States Senate, and when it comes to getting things done for Michigan we need decisive leadership.”

Stabenow continued to stress her focus on jobs and the economy, discussing specific proposals and successes, including her tax credit for manufacturers who say ‘no’ to outsourcing and create jobs here in America and her bipartisan proposal to create a US Trade Prosecutor to fight for American companies and help level the playing field on trade.

The debate, sponsored by the Detroit Economic Club, will be broadcast this evening at XXXX on XXX and on Detroit Public Television on Sunday, October 29th.

“When forced off the script provided by the Bush administration he couldn’t even come up with a yes or no answer on the war in Iraq,” said Stabenow Spokesperson Brent Colburn. “Michigan deserves better and Michigan voters demand more. This isn’t about Republicans and Democrats, but it is about leadership that will take a stand on the issues and talk straight to the people of Michigan. On that test Debbie Stabenow passed with flying colors while Mike Bouchard straight up failed.”
